# CPM REPRESENTS CA CITIES AND COUNTIES IN MUNICIPAL BOND ANTITRUST CASES



Nanci Nishimura and Steve Williams are leading CPM in representing California cities, counties and public agencies in Municipal Derivatives complaints against dozens of financial institutions including

Goldman Sachs, JP Morgan Chase, UBS, Citibank, Morgan Stanley and Wells Fargo/Wachovia. The defendants are alleged to have price fixed municipal derivatives instruments, such as Guaranteed Investment Contracts ("GICs"). Municipal derivatives are used by cities, counties and agencies to invest public monies after a bond is issued in order to protect those monies prior to being spent for public purposes. **Nishimura** and **Williams** lead a team of **Stuart Gross, Aron Liang** and **Daniel Sterrett** to help Main Street fight the Wall Street banks.

# MARK MOLUMPHY LEADS SECURITIES CASES AGAINST FREDDIE MAC AND WALL STREET BANKS IN *NEW YORK*



Cotchett, Pitre & McCarthy has been appointed lead counsel in the federal class action on behalf of Freddie Mac Preferred shareholders. Mark Molumphy and Joseph Cotchett with their team of Matt Edling, Imtiaz Siddiqui and Jordanna Thigpen are leading the firm in the case alleging that Freddie Mac's management, auditor and underwriters of its preferred

stock offerings, namely – Merrill Lynch, Citigroup Global Markets, Morgan Stanley & Co., UBS Securities, and Wachovia Capital Markets – (a) overstated Fannie Mae's capitalization, (b) failed to disclose material facts, and (c) misled investors to believe that they were protected from subprime losses.

## LAWSUIT FILED BY *FILIPINO VETERANS* AGAINST VETERANS AFFAIRS FOR PROMISED BENEFITS



Filipino veterans who fought for the United States in World War II have been forced to sue for their justly deserved and long denied benefits. The lawsuit was filed by <u>former Congressman</u> **Pete McCloskey** and **Stuart Gross** of CPM and the Tancinco Law Offices against the Dept. of Veterans Affairs in Federal Court. During WWII, approximately 250,000 Filipino soldiers fought alongside the U.S.

Army against the Japanese and were promised the same benefits that were given to the U.S. Army soldiers. For over 60 years, Filipino veterans have fought to get official recognition of their honorable U.S. military service during World War II and to be declared eligible to receive full veterans benefits from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. **McCloskey** is a former U.S. Marine who served in Korea and was awarded the Navy Cross, the Silver Star and two awards of the Purple Heart.

#### MUNI BOND INSURANCE RATING AGENCIES CASES FOR PUBLIC ENTITIES

CPM represents numerous CA <u>Cities</u>, <u>Counties</u>, <u>Agen-</u> <u>cies</u>, and <u>Non-Profits</u> who were forced to pay millions of dollars in premiums for insurance as credit support to raise funds for public projects and millions more when the insurers' credit ratings collapsed with the subprime market. These cases represent <u>tax dollars</u> wrongfully taken from public entities. The Credit Rating Agencies are alleged to have conspired with the insurance companies.

The lawsuit challenges CalTrans' approval of a controversial highway widening and realignment project which will require the removal of

the ancient redwoods and destroy the Park.

## FINEMAN FEATURED IN BOALT HALL SCHOOL OF LAW TRANSCRIPT FOR INTERVIEW WITH MADOFF AND MADOFF LITIGATION



In the Spring 2010 issue of Transcript, Nancy Fineman was featured for her exclusive four hour interview with Bernard Madoff in prison. Fineman along with Joseph Cotchett are the only attorneys in the country who were given permission to speak with Madoff. CPM represents victims of the Madoff fraud. Fineman said, it was "jarring to sit across from the guy responsible for the worst of the worst. I saw how much he hurt our clients and how little remorse he showed. He said the words, but didn't seem to feel them at all... Our clients trusted this man... The hurt is not just financial, but a feeling of betrayal and investing trust in someone who didn't honor that." Fineman was featured on CNBC, FoxBusiness News, MSNBC,

New York Magazine and Vanity Fair for her representation of victims of the Madoff scam in New York courts.

## FRANK PITRE APPOINTED NATIONAL CO-LEAD COUNSEL IN TOYOTA SUDDEN UNINTENDED ACCELERATION CASES



United States District Judge James V. Selna appointed **Frank Pitre** of CPM as Co-Lead Counsel for the Economic Loss Committee in the Toyota lawsuits. The MDL involves more than 200 lawsuits divided into two groups: losses on behalf of consumers and others who have lost value on their Toyotas, and for people who have

been injured or killed in a Toyota. Frank Pitre, along with Steve Berman and Marc Seltzer were selected as Co-Lead

Counsel for those cases seeking economic losses. Toyota, the world's largest automaker, faces numerous federal and state lawsuits. Toyota, a Japan-based company has recalled more than 8 million vehicles for fixes related to sudden unintended acceleration. The automaker announced in September that it was recalling 3.8 million Toyota and Lexus vehicles because of a defect that may cause floor mats to jam accelerator pedals. The company later recalled vehicles over defects involving pedals themselves. Recently, Pitre served as a National Co-Chair of the Bextra-Celebrex litigation which resulted in a settlement of \$894 million.
