

KGO Radio Interview: CPM Partner Wildfire Litigation Expert Discusses "Is PG&E Responsible for the North Bay Fires?"

A Santa Rosa couple who lost their home in the North Bay wildfires is taking action. The couple filed a lawsuit against PG&E Tuesday citing negligence on behalf of the utility company as the source of the blaze that destroyed more than 5,000 structures, ravaged over 200,000 acres and killed 42.

The lawsuit comes in the midst of Cal Fire's investigation into PG&E's potential role in the fires.

Host Brian Copeland was joined by somewhat of an expert on the topic, Attorney Frank Pitre.

Pitre has represented hundreds of plaintiffs against PG&E in past lawsuits against the company, including the 2010 San Bruno gas line explosion case in which PG&E was fined \$1.6 billion by the PUC for negligence.
